Purchase With a Purpose December 2014

Thank you everyone who has shopped, shared, worked at the table on Sundays, sorted gift cards and ordered. Your Purchase With a Purpose makes a difference in the lives of women and children everywhere.

If you need a last minute gift or stocking stuffer we continue to have Amazon, Home Depot, iTunes, Jewel, Kohl's, Meijer, Panera Bread, Speedway Gas, Starbuck's, Target, Ultra Foods, Walgreens, and Downers Grove Downtown Dollars ready to pick up at the table in the Parlor every Sunday!

Our last order of the year will be placed on December 14th and arrangements can be made for you to pick up your order in the church office during the week. Check and Carry of our regular cards and order pick up will continue through the holidays and on January 4th, 2015 we will resume ordertaking.

Kohl's is the only merchant that allows customers to pay their charge card bill with gift cards in \$25 (available every week) and \$100 denominations. When you receive your bill, order the cards you need on Sunday so that you'll be in time to pay your bill. You can pay it at the check out as well as customer service!

I continue to encourage you take advantage of the convenience of ordering online from home at www.MannaOrders.net. You can buy your usual gift cards and pick them up on Sunday or you can get certain specialty cards directly to your email address via MannaEscrip. You can also send someone else a gift via email. The list of MannaEscrip is at the PWP table and can be found online at www.MannaGroup.net. Ask Ina for an account at inamairi@mac.com.

Any regular Amazon shoppers could help raise money in two ways. Use AmazonSmile and choose an organization to benefit. I chose UPAVIM. Use the BenefitAPP to buy your Amazon gift cards to load onto your account and PWP earns money. Download the Benefit MobileAPP and register with First United Methodist Downers Grove, Purchase With A Purpose. You will need to set up your bank account for direct debit but once that is in place you can buy gift cards at any time and use your phone to pay in store or online. I have been using this APP at Target and there are a couple of things helpful to know, ask me!

These are convenient ways to buy gift cards without having to remember your check book on Sunday morning!
