Purchase With A Purpose

Summer saw a slow down in sales at the Purchase With a Purpose table. Apart from our pledges the Purchase With a Purpose gift card program is our major fund raiser to support the work of United Methodist Women. Think about how you can increase your participation in the program and encourage your friends and circle members also.

Try keeping a gas card in your car so that your teen driver doesn't get caught with no money and an empty tank. Have some small denomination fast food cards to give to someone in need or to use yourself! Great American Bagel, KFC, Starbucks and Subway come in \$5 denominations, most others are \$10. The new grocery store in the area, Angelo Caputos, offers gift cards in \$25 and \$100 denominations and they are available to order.

Every Sunday we continue to have Amazon, Home Depot, Jewel, Kohl's, Meijer, Panera Bread, Speedway Gas, Starbuck's, Target, Ulta Cosmetics, Ultra Foods, Walgreens, and Downers Grove Downtown Dollars ready to pick up at the table in the Parlor! Orders will be placed on the 2nd and 4th Sundays of the month through November.

Many of us are enjoying the convenience of ordering online from home. You do have to pay directly from your checking account as credit cards charge a fee which would take away our small % earned. The cards are still delivered to church with our regular order but you can browse the gift card selection at home and don't need to remember your check book on Sunday morning!

Manna Group has offered us the opportunity to use an APP on our smart phones which will allow us to buy the gift card whilst we are out shopping. If you find yourself at Target, for example, and don't have a gift card, you can use the APP to buy what you need and scan your phone to pay at the checkout. There are a limited number of stores participating, so far, and some of the % earned are less but something is better than nothing! If you are interested in trying this convenient instant gift card system Ina can send you the details of how to set yourself up.

Kohl's is the only merchant that allows customers to pay their charge card bill with gift cards in \$25 (available every week) and \$100 denominations. When you receive your bill, order the cards you need on Sunday so that you'll be in time to pay your bill. You can pay it at the check out as well as customer service!
