#### Purchase With a Purpose

Thank you for your continued support of PWP helping to raise money for UMW's mission projects by purchasing gift cards to use for your own shopping or to give as gifts. We have raised almost \$3000 so far this year and hope to reach our goal of \$5000.

Every Sunday we have Amazon, Dairy Queen, Home Depot, iTunes, Jewel, Kohl's, Meijer, Panera Bread, Speedway Gas, Starbuck's, Target, Ultra Foods, Walgreens, and Downers Grove Downtown Dollars ready to pick up at the table in the Parlor!

To make way for some different holiday specials I will be removing the Dairy Queen gift cards from the box as they sell out so if you want to have a final summer treat of ice cream buy your gift card first.

PWP orders are placed on the 2nd and 4th Sundays of the month through November. Anyone who has signed up for an account to order online from the convenience of home gets an email reminder on the day the order will be placed. Email Ina, at inamairi@mac.com, if you would like to set up an account. The cards will still be delivered to church with our regular order but you can browse the gift card selection at home and don't need to remember your check book on Sunday morning!

Manna has recently added some new retailers to the gift card program. Nordstrom available as a \$25 or \$100 card earns us 4% and may be used at Nordstrom, Nordstrom Rack and Hautelook. Bakers Square available as a \$25 card earns us 14%. Various cards offer an extra % bonus from time to time and I will try to keep everyone updated when these promotions occur.

Also don't forget the Benefit Mobile APP for your smart phone that allows you to buy gift cards as and when you need them. Download the APP, register with First United Methodist Downers Grove, Purchase With A Purpose and set up your bank account for direct debit, or a credit card. Some retailers, such as Whole Foods, allow you to buy the exact amount of your bill so you never have to carry a balance on the card.

# From your Missions Coordinator for Social Action National Seminar, August 2015 – InterRupting Indifference: Jesus, Justice, and Joy

Guided by our esteemed theologian Dr. Mai-Anh Le Tran, professor at Eden Theological Seminary, we examined Luke 19. Luke tells us that Zacchaeus climbed a tree to see Jesus better? Do you suppose he climbed the tree because

of the madding crowd? We know, after all, that the run-of-the-mill tax collector wasn't favored by the people. So Jesus said that he was going to intentionally visit with Zacchaeus, and we learned of Zacchaeus' willingness to repay 4x those whom were cheated. Economic divide. Those holding the money, the debt. Those cheated. Where do you see the intersection of this parable and our 2015 economic divisiveness? Perhaps if we consider the shift from Zacchaeus being 'safe' in the tree versus 'saved' in the presence of Jesus Christ, we can begin to visualize what justice looks like in our current reality. Are we (are others) being safe for ourselves (themselves) or embracing the freedom in Christ to extend economic justice?

For five days, two hundred (200!) United Methodist Women from *every* conference in this country studied the characteristics, effects, causal relationships, and injustices of *Climate*, *Mass Incarceration*, *Income Inequality*, and *Maternal and Child Welfare*. We prepared prior to our arrival to the seminar using webinars and personal reflection on individual communities from which we came. Where do we see effects and answers to climate injustice in our community? Where do we see the effects and practices of mass incarceration in disproportionate number of black persons? How has our community answered to opening the accessibility of healthcare and related education for expectant mothers and infants (0-12 mos.)? Where do we see the practices and effects of income inequality?

I (along with Marcia Williams (Chicago Southern district) and Allison Anderson (Elgin district)) was humbly honored to represent the Northern Illinois conference in the most amazing gathering of diversity from our faith and mission-based sisterhood of United Methodist Women. Leadership and staff from UMW New York offices masterfully coordinated daily worship, site visits to ARISE Chicago and the Pilsen neighborhood, and the most dynamic professors and organizational leaders of societal equality. University of Illinois at Chicago was home to the seminar, and y'all should be really proud of the NIC conference leadership stepping up and out to extend hospitality to countless air travelers and tentative Chicago guests!

In the coming quadrenium (2016 – 2019) all 800,000 members including our AURORA DISTRICT of UMW will begin to have local conversations about these same areas of justice building. And beyond just TALK, we will move ideas into ACTION. These four topics of *Economic Inequality*, *Climate Justice*, *Maternal and Child Welfare*, and *Mass Incarceration* are broad and thick in rhetoric, research and statistics. In the months to come I will examine other parables from Luke 19 and how scripture and our faith imperative leads us to work toward just change in our Aurora District. May God's grace be among us as we unravel the challenging work of creating justice in our communities.


