One service at 10:00 a.m.**

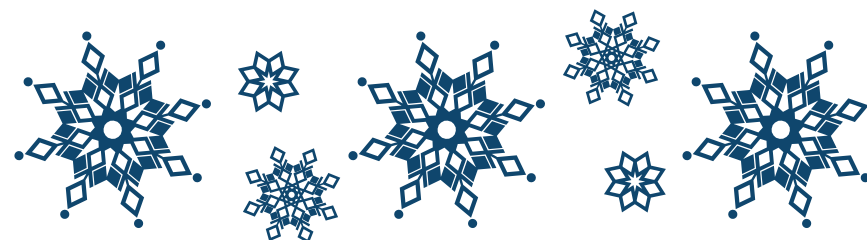
There will be no 8:30 a.m. service this Sunday.
